INTRODUCTION TO CREATIVE WRITING ½ Credit (Grades 9-12)

FEE: None

(Taught at FFC)


Introduction to Creative Writing is designed for students who wish to develop the skills and tools needed to think and write more creatively. Students will study a variety of genres in order to more effectively write and critique short stories, poems, essays, and plays.

CREATIVE WRITING I (Grades 9-12)

FEE: None

Creative Writing I is designed for students who wish to express themselves creatively. Students are required to contribute pieces suited to the literary publication. Students read, study, and write short stories, poems, essays, and one-act plays which will then be entered in local, state, and national writing contests. Students are also expected to keep a writing portfolio and to complete individual projects, which may then be printed in the literary publication.

CREATIVE WRITING II (Expository Composition)(Grades 10-12)

FEE: None

Prerequisites: Creative Writing I

Building on skills learned in Creative Writing I, students become more comfortable expressing themselves as writers of short stories, poems, essays and one-act plays. Students are required to contribute pieces suited to the literary publication. They maintain their writing portfolio and continue to enter local, state and national writing contests.

CREATIVE WRITING III (American Literature)(Grades 11-12)

FEE: None

Prerequisites: Creative Writing II

In their third year of Creative Writing, students continue to experiment with all genres of writing, but they also begin to focus on the type(s) to which their muse directs them. Students are required to contribute pieces suited to the literary publication. They maintain their writing portfolio and continue to enter local, state and national writing contests.

CREATIVE WRITING IV (Grades 9-12)

FEE: None

Prerequisites: Creative Writing I, II, and III or approval by instructor

Students will serve in leadership positions and publish for Florence High School's literary arts publication. It contains writing of all genres (short stories, poems, essays and one-act plays) as well as artwork, photography and

other graphics – all done by students. Any student in the Creative Writing classes may be considered for the staff since staff members are chosen based on their determination and willingness to go beyond the call of duty to produce an exceptional magazine.
